Pertussis (Whooping Cough)

Dear Parents and Staff,

A person who attends Kegworth Public School has been diagnosed with whooping cough (pertussis). I am writing to provide you with information about this illness and ask that you watch for the symptoms, especially over the next three weeks.

If you or your child develops symptoms, please go to your local doctor as soon as possible and take this letter with you.

What is Pertussis?

Pertussis is an infection of the throat that often begins like a cold and cough. This can progress to bouts of coughing, and sometimes breathing difficulties and vomiting after coughing. It can be a very serious infection in small children, however older children and adults can also get pertussis and pass it on to others. People with pertussis are infectious for the first 3 weeks of their illness or until they have completed a 5 day course of the recommended antibiotics. The coughing can last between one and three months.

What should people sick with pertussis do?

To help prevent this infection spreading, people who have been diagnosed with pertussis should not attend school until they have completed a five day course of the recommended antibiotics. If antibiotics cannot be taken, then they must stay away for 3 weeks after the onset of cough.

How is it prevented?

Most children in Australia are immunised against pertussis as it is a standard childhood immunisation. However, immunity does decrease with time and in some people immunity to the disease is not guaranteed with vaccination. It is important to note that although your child may be immunised, they may still become infected. Please ensure that younger children at home are up to date with their whooping cough immunisations and adults who have not had a pertussis vaccination in the past ten years should see their local doctor to discuss getting a booster.

INFORMATION FOR GPs

This letter has been sent to people who attend a school with a CONFIRMED case of pertussis.

Pertussis immunity, either from vaccination or infection, wanes over time. Some people with pertussis have been fully vaccinated and present with mild symptoms.

Individuals with pertussis, even those with mild symptoms, are infectious and can pass the illness on to others.

Definitive diagnosis and treatment of whooping cough is important for coughing adults and children to protect young infants and other vulnerable people.

Please consider whooping cough in anyone with a persistent cough, even if mild, especially if an epidemiological link can be established.

RECOMMENDED PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- Nucleic Acid Testing (NAT) or PCR with a nasopharyngeal swab is the diagnostic method of choice for whooping cough*
- Anyone with pertussis is to keep away from childcare/school/work until they are non-infectious



ETHICS CLASSES AT KEGWORTH PUBLIC SCHOOL

Could you be an ethics coordinator or an ethics teacher for Kegworth?

Our current ethics coordinator and one of our ethics teachers are moving on at the end of this year and we are seeking volunteers so that classes can continue next year. Ethics classes began at Kegworth in 2012 and are currently available for children in classes from grade 2 to grade 6.

The ethics coordinator communicates with school staff, supports ethics teachers and liaises with Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the program.

This role provides a great opportunity for a working parent who might be unable to volunteer during school hours and is a rewarding way to engage with the school community. Times are flexible, requiring approximately 1 hour per week. Online training is provided.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at 2:45pm on Thursday afternoons each week.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- fairness
