#### Presidents Report Kegworth Public School P&C – 2017

A very big thank you to everyone involved in the P&C for 2017 and all the community volunteers. We had some amazing highlights that come to mind

- **The FARE** this year the FARE raised almost \$40,000 which is an incredible result, especially given the weather situation. The other highlight here was the collaboration with the FARE team and the P&C. We have all worked incredibly hard to help the overall Kegworth community.
- **130<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** and community support (tea towels) With some local political guest we have now formed great relationships and can call on these people to assist the school moving forward.

**Woolworths Earn and Learn** – from 19,000 in the previous year to 45,000! This was a massive effort and thank you to everyone involved, especially, Karen Trish, Pip and Helen. The orders will arrive early 2018 and we look forward to the school receiving sporting equipment, books and arts and crafts.

**Traffic and Road Safety** – We pushed Roads Maritime Services and Roads Safety to ensure that Kegworth was higher on the list regarding the Red Flashing lights for the school zones which was a great result. This was a big win, as a number of schools still don't have flashing light school zone signs. We continue to be challenged on a few of the other road safety and parking issues and will continue to stay focused on child safety.

**Communication -** We have really tried this year to communicate and over communicate. We started the newsletters, and they have been well received, with positive feedback from many of the parents. The other great communication avenue is the new P&C noticeboard. We are all being very deliberate in our communications to ensure people understand what we are doing and where the money is being spent and what impact we are having on the school.

**Gardening Bees -** We held one gardening bee this year and with great success, we managed to uncover some families with landscape type businesses that were of great assistance. We also had the garden beds finished in the senior playground near the cottage. Thank you Leon for leading the working bees.

**Clean Up – P&C Shed and container** - This year we had two clean ups in this area too. Late October, we did the full clean out of the P&C Shed at the school and managed to completely empty and organise this space – A massive achievement for all involved! **KOOSCH** – We have ensured we have great communication and partnership across the school activities. We have part funded things both ways to support the school and will continue to stay focused on best interest for the children especially in regard to safety.

**School Banking** – A very big thank you to all the volunteers that help run the School Banking program. This is a great initiative that encourages good financial habits for kids early and helps them understand the concept of saving. This program was kicked off by someone that was very passionate about this and made a difference – Thank you to Deb Soler who implemented the program.



### ETHICS CLASSES AT KEGWORTH PUBLIC SCHOOL

Could you be an ethics coordinator or an ethics teacher for Kegworth?

Our current ethics coordinator and one of our ethics teachers are moving on at the end of this year and we are seeking volunteers so that classes can continue next year. Ethics classes began at Kegworth in 2012 and are currently available for children in classes from grade 2 to grade 6.

**The ethics coordinator** communicates with school staff, supports ethics teachers and liaises with Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the program.

This role provides a great opportunity for a working parent who might be unable to volunteer during school hours and is a rewarding way to engage with the school community. Times are flexible, requiring approximately 1 hour per week. Online training is provided.

**Ethics teachers** receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at 2:45pm on Thursday afternoons each week.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- fairness
