❖ SCOOTER-BIKE-A-THON UPDATE

A huge thank you to the generosity of our Kegworth community!!

Not only did the Foundation provide a bike using funds raised for Ashlynn (which was our initial intention) but because of the huge amounts of funds raised, the John MacLean Foundation was also able to provide support for another 2 x kids - Jackson, who has Hereditary Spastic Paraparesis and is a part time wheelchair user (\$2,126.00) and Lucas, who has Cerebral Palsy and uses an electric wheelchair full time, who outgrew his first bike some time ago and hasn't been able to replace it due to a lack of funding (\$1431.00).

❖ DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES

Thank you to the parents who attend the parent presentation for the school's revised Discipline Procedures last week. The feedback received was very positive and the presentation outline gave parents a clearer understanding of the positive reward system, consequences for negative behaviours and the process associated for both.

Kegworth's Discipline Procedures are now available to view on the school's website. Another parent presentation will be held during Term 1 2018 for any new and / or existing parents and caregivers – more details next year.

❖ STAFFING UPDATE

The school has been advised that the vacant teacher position (previously filled by Mrs Ann Lennox) was to be filled by a Closed Merit Selection process. Our thanks and appreciation go to our school panel consisting of Mr Philip Toovey (convenor), Mrs Josie Giardina (teacher representative) and Ms Jennifer Vincent (parent representative) who have been interviewing prospective teachers (as a part of this process) last week to appoint a permanent member of staff to begin in 2018. Further information will be provided as to the successful candidate once the process has been finalised.

Our other vacant permanent position, previously held by Mrs Jasmin Kolev is still being finalised via the DoE's HR Department. We hope to have an answer on this teaching position shortly.

❖ 2018 CLASS PLANNING

Planning for 2018 is already underway. Over the past weeks, there has been a change in the number of students who will be enrolled at Kegworth for the following year which is causing the anticipated school structure to float between 13 and 14 classes.

Ideally, the school would prefer to stay within a 14 class structure which would eliminate the need for cross stage classes such as a 2/3 or a 4/5 composite. The school is reviewing 2018 funding entitlements and along with considerable P&C financial support, it is hoped that a 14 class structure and employment of a temporary teacher for next year, comes to fruition. More details will be provided once the 2018 structure is secured.

❖ MUSIC NIGHT

Hope you will be joining us for our annual showcase of student musical talents this coming Friday night. Our school community are invited to attend, regardless of whether you have a child performing or not. Performances by all of the groups including Kookaburra, Junior & Senior Choirs, Opera House Recorder group, Junior and Senior String Ensembles and Junior and Senior Bands and a special student guitar performance, will be on the program. It's a fabulous way to finish off the school year!

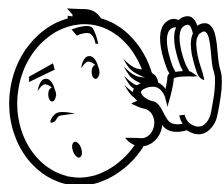

ETHICS CLASSES AT KEGWORTH PUBLIC SCHOOL

Could you be an **ethics coordinator** or an **ethics teacher** for Kegworth?

Our current ethics coordinator and one of our ethics teachers are moving on at the end of this year and we are seeking volunteers so that classes can continue next year. Ethics classes began at Kegworth in 2012 and are currently available for children in classes from grade 2 to grade 6.

The ethics coordinator communicates with school staff, supports ethics teachers and liaises with Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the program.

This role provides a great opportunity for a working parent who might be unable to volunteer during school hours and is a rewarding way to engage with the school community. Times are flexible, requiring approximately 1 hour per week. Online training is provided.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at 2:45pm on Thursday afternoons each week.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as:

- imagining how others feel
- how do we treat living things?
- what is laziness?
- how do we disagree in a respectful way?
- fairness
