K - 6 Performing Arts Concert "Korigin"

It's super exciting here in the lead up for our Performing Arts Concert on <u>Thursday 26</u> <u>September</u> at Sydney Secondary College – Leichhardt.

All K – 6 students are involved in a performing arts concert item.

COSTUME REQUIREMENTS

All K – 6 students should have received information regarding permission notes and costumes requirements. Please contact your child's class teacher if you have any questions. It is best that that all students wear their suggested costume or most of their costume to school on the day as there is little opportunity to get changed throughout the day.

An outline of costume requirements are as follows:

Kindergarten:

<u>Boys</u>: Coloured plain t-shirt (your choice of colour) - no logos or prints please. Navy or black shorts. Dark coloured sandshoes or black school shoes

<u>Girls:</u> Black T-shirt - no logos or prints please. Black long leggings. Dark coloured sandshoes or black school shoes Hair to be pulled back in a high pony tail

Year 1:

<u>Boys & Girls</u>: Plain primary coloured T-shirt (ie: red, yellow or blue) - no logos or prints please. Long black pants or leggings. Dark coloured sandshoes or black school shoes. Hair to be pulled back in a **high pony tail** (no ribbons please)

<u>Year 2:</u>

<u>Boys:</u> Coloured plain singlet top (your choice of colour) - no logos or prints please. Blue school sports shorts. Knee high white socks. Sandshoes

<u>Girls:</u> Coloured plain singlet top (your choice of colour) - no logos or prints please. Black leggings (ie: active wear). White ankle socks. Sandshoes. Hair to be pulled back in a low pony tail at the nape of the neck - no high ponytails or pigtails please

Year 3:

Boys & Girls - students to choose their own favourite clothes or costumes. Some ideas include:

- If your child is a dancer, s/he could wear a dance outfit (may bring dance shoes with them)
- If your child has a favourite sport, they could wear that uniform
- If your child has a favourite dress-up outfit that could also be an option.

Please ensure that your child is able to move easily in their outfit, that their vision isn't obstructed and that they have closed in shoes in which they can dance (no 'tap' shoes)

Year 4:

Boys: Black plain T-shirt - no logos or prints please. Black long pants. Socks and sandshoes - preferably dark

<u>Girls:</u> Black plain T-shirt - no logos or prints please. Black long pants or long leggings. Socks and sandshoes - preferably dark

Year 5:

<u>Boys & Girls:</u> wear a combination of white shirts and denim. Any T-Shirt, Shirt, Singlet, Hoodie or any other white top – no logos or prints please. Denim Jeans, denim shorts, denim overalls, jeggings, denim cargo pants, denim hats, denim hair bands / scrunchies or bandannas etc. and sandshoes on their feet.

Year 6:

Boys & Girls – Fluoro bright coloured T-shirt – no logos or prints please. Jeans and sandshoes. Hair to be pulled back in a high pony tail

REHEARSALS

All students performing in the Performing Arts Concert will need to attend the rehearsal at Sydney Secondary College – Leichhardt on <u>Thursday 26 September 2019</u>, in the morning. All information has been forwarded via Skoolbag with an e-form <u>permission slip that must be returned with the \$8.50 payment</u> for buses.

Students who have <u>not</u> brought in their note and payment, will <u>not</u> be able to attend on this day.Please note that we will not be contacting any parents on the morning of the rehearsal to seek verbal permission for students to attend.

This rehearsal is a <u>dress rehearsal</u>. All student performers must arrive at school in the morning dressed in their item clothing. Lunch and recess should be brought to the rehearsal in your child's school bag – please ensure that all lunch boxes bags are clearly labelled. There will <u>be no school canteen access</u> on this day.

PERFORMANCE CONCERT

For the afternoon concert, doors open to our parents and friends from **1:00pm**. The Concert begins promptly **at 1:30pm**.

• ENTRY TO THE HALL IS ONLY FROM DERBYSHIRE ROAD (see below).

Please <u>do not enter</u> the hall via the main school office as this is disruptive to Leichhardt - Sydney Secondary School, staff and students. Concert programs will be available upon entry into the hall.

• ENTRY FEE OF \$5:00 PER PERSON OR \$15:00 PER FAMILY GROUP of three or more, would be appreciated. These funds will then be used to supplement future performing arts concert requirements.

All of our K - 6 students will already be in seated position in the front of the auditorium – it would be appreciated if parents did not disturb or take any students away during this time so that they do not miss their important cueing performance time.

Please be advised that this is still a normal school day for the High School students at Sydney Secondary College. As our Concert beginning and conclusion time will overlap during their lunchtime and dismissal times – it would be appreciated if parents and friends could enter and exit the school hall from entrances located on Derbyshire Road (parallel to Pioneers' Memorial Park) to avoid disruption to the College's regular routine.

DURING THE CONCERT:-

During the Concert, we ask all of our audience to:

- please turn off mobile phones;
- avoid walking in and out while items are being performed on the stage;
- Food and beverages are <u>not</u> permitted in the School Hall.
- Smoking is also <u>not</u> permitted on school property.

CONCLUSION OF CONCERT:-

- At the completion of the Concert, we will be requesting that the AUDIENCE LEAVE THE HALL and wait across the road to wait in Pioneer Park.
- All students will remain on the stage area until the hall is cleared.
- When the hall is cleared, students will then move to collect their bags & belongings. Class groups will then move to Pioneer Park, accompanied by class teachers.
- Once your child's class has assembled in Pioneer Park, it is only then that parents and carers can approach to take your child home.
- Please ensure that you have seen the class teacher prior to leaving to mark off your child's name, prior to leaving. It is essential that all students have their names marked off for safety reasons.
- If your child is being collected by another family member (ie: grandparent) or is going home with a friend's parent you must advise your child's class teacher in writing prior to the performance day. This can be done directly via email, dojo or seesaw app. Do not send this information on the performance day as teachers will be too busy throughout the day to access this information.
- Parents & carers are reminded that it is your responsibility to advise any music tutors and or Team Kids if your child will not be in attendance for that activity, on that afternoon.
- Students who are not collected will be returning by bus, with class teachers, to school.

Balmain Zone Athletics Carnival 2019

On Thursday 15th August, nearly 40 of Kegworth's most elite athletes competed at the 2019 Balmain Zone Athletics Carnival pitting their talents against other pantheons of the inner-west.

Shortly after the rising of the sun our athletes were transferred by bus across a waking city to the ES Marks Athletics Field in Kensington.

Many had suffered a fitful night's sleep due to nervous excitement of what may lay ahead the following day: athletes with spikes, the bang of the starter's pistol, the roar coming from the stands situated along the home straight, the commanding shouts from marshals, and the professional running surface of the track.
