ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS

Kegworth is stepping up its commitment with our environmental responsibilities, to significantly reduce our waste, to support a more fruitful future for our children.

Our focus for Term 4 will be the reduction of plastic coming from our school canteen. DON'T PANIC... this will be a slow and thoughtful process.

Our first step will be to remove the use of plastic forks and spoons from the canteen. In preparation for this, a group of Stage 3 girls have been working tirelessly with me





almost every lunch time for over a term, to create calico bags to store clean forks and spoons in each classroom. These girls designed, evaluated and improved the bags, which they have stitched by hand and with patience on a sub-standard machine. Finally one bag has been completed. We were given some

great news last week by a Petersham community member, Ann O'Brien, who has generously sourced and donated a better quality machine to Kegworth PS. The girls and I thank her dearly. When the forks and spoons have



been used they will be collected by our Environmental

Warriors and washed in the staffroom dishwasher.

How can I help? I hear you asking...

Well it's easy. In the link-way closest to Lords Rd, you will find a tote tray with a label

<u>"FORK AND SPOON DONATIONS"</u> Simply drop in a spoon (tea or table) or a fork for our collection.

In addition, our committed SRC, will be assisting us, in rolling out a soft plastics collection. Each class will



be expected to have all scrunchable plastics placed in a dedicated bag. A poster will also be provided to clear up any confusion.

When the bag is full, the SRC students from each class will return it to 4R, where a new bag will be given. The soft plastics will be delivered over to Woolworth or Coles for recycling. Of course, we would prefer it, if we boycotted any single portion packaging in the first place, as we are just placing convenience before the environment.

Envirobank Update:



Our school community has continued to collect 10c containers to reduce landfill. At a total of approximately \$3200, we have successfully made sure that at least 32000 bottles have been recycled, what an effort Kegworth – that's commitment!

We have had a slight change in our collection pick-ups, now only having them once a term.

The next collection is on Tuesday December 3. Please continue collecting and bring the bags into school whenever it is convenient for you. Take another bag, fill it and return... repeat, repeat, repeat!! ©

Our dedicated Enviro-team continue to sort, store, collect lids and count our bags. I'm exceptionally grateful to these committed students, who at a drop of a hat whenever need,

they give up their lunch break... this would more regular than anyone would realise. They are a reliable and organised TEAM.

We are now also collecting the lids to send to Lids for Kid, an organisation, which makes prosthetic limbs for children. It truly is a win - win!!







Our outstanding collector for Term 3 was Charly P (5/6T), who regularly brings in many Envirobags. Her secret to success... take a few extra bags home and give them to family and friends. I'm loving the dedication Charly is showing to the environment and Kegworth.
