REMEMBRANCE DAY 2019

HONOUR OUR FALLEN THIS REMEMBRANCE DAY



At 5am on 11 November 1918, three German government representatives accepted the Armistice terms presented to them by an allied commander, General Foch of the French Army. The demands of the Armistice included the withdrawal of German forces to the east bank of the Rhine within 30 days; immediate cessation of warfare; and surrender of the German fleet and all heavy guns with no further negotiations until the signing of the peace treaty. The armistice became effective at 11am the same day, and as the guns fell silent on the Western Front in France and Belgium, four years of hostilities ended.

The cease-fire was made permanent the following year when members of the Commonwealth and the League of Nations signed the Treaty of Versailles. People across the world celebrated the war's end - celebrations tempered by thoughts of the enormous suffering and loss of life resulting from the War.

World War I began in 1914 and lasted for four years. More than 416 000 Australians volunteered for service in World War I. Of these, 324 000 served overseas. More than 60 000 Australians were killed, including 45 000 who died on the Western Front in France and Belgium and more than 8 000 who died on the Gallipoli Peninsula in Turkey. As well as Australian soldiers, many nurses in the Australian Army Nursing Service served on the Western Front. These nurses worked in overcrowded hospitals for up to 16 hours a day,

looking after soldiers with shocking injuries and burns. Those who worked in hospitals close to the fighting were also in danger of being shelled by the enemy.

In Australia and other allied countries, including New Zealand, Canada and the United States, 11 November became known as Armistice Day - a day to remember those who died in World War I. The day continues to be commemorated in Allied countries.

After World War II the Australian Government agreed to the United Kingdom's proposal that Armistice Day be renamed **Remembrance Day** to commemorate those who were killed in both World Wars. Today the loss of Australian lives from all wars and conflicts is commemorated on Remembrance Day. In October 1997 the then Governor-General issued a Proclamation declaring 11 November as Remembrance Day - a day to remember the sacrifice of those who have died for Australia in wars and conflicts. The Proclamation reinforced the importance of Remembrance Day and encouraged all Australians to renew their observance of the event.



OBSERVATION OF SILENCE AT 11:00 AM

As a mark of respect to those who have died and suffered, people in Australia are encouraged to stop. At 11 am on 11 November 1919, Australians, for the first time, paused and stood in silent tribute to the men and women of the 1st Australian Imperial Force who had died on battlefields in Gallipoli, Europe and in the Middle East. In 1997, the Governor-General issued a proclamation urging all Australians to observe the one minute silence on Remembrance Day. It is also still appropriate for two minutes' silence to be observed.

On Remembrance Day, our school will stop at 11:00am for a minute of silence as a sign of respect and in recognition for our fallen service men and women.



Years K – 2 - Poetica



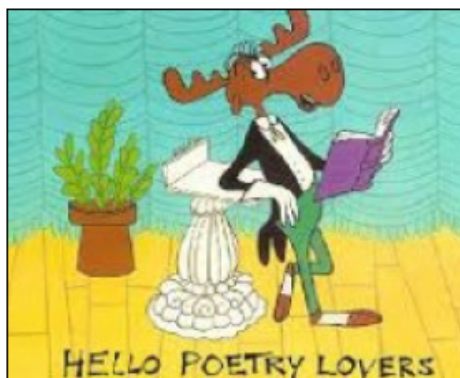
Once again Years K - 2 students will have the opportunity to share and hear favourite poems. We are hoping to hear poems that are funny, beautiful, whimsical or interesting.

Teaching Expectations & Rules

Term 4 Focus

Teaching matrix expectations: Commitment

Responding to Teacher Instructions:

- ‘Stop, Look and Listen’
- ‘Eyes and ears to me’ ‘Lips closed’
- ‘Fold your arms’.

Context	<i>Classroom, Music Hall, Art Room, Playground</i>
Tell	<i>Discuss why rule is important: Maximizes learning time, clarity, safety.</i> <i>Real world connections: Fire Drills, knowing what you have to do- performing arts concert, important in groups, being part of a team.</i>
Show	<p>Model the rule including non-examples:</p> <p>-Eyes and ears to the speaker, ‘Stop, Look and Listen’ What does stop mean/look like, -stop moving-stop talking, things out of hand, eyes on speaker.</p> <p>- respond in the first instance to instruction (countdown)</p> <p>-Non examples- continuing to talk or move, continuing with task, moving before instruction has been finished, not following instructions in timely/efficient manner.</p> <p>Note that the adult models the non-example (not the student).</p>
Practise	Give students opportunities to role play the rule across all relevant settings.
Feedback	<p><i>Observe student performance & give positive specific feedback</i></p> <p><i>‘Well done, for responding to instructions promptly’</i></p> <p><i>‘Well, I can see that you are following my instructions’</i></p>
