PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome back to everyone for a new term of learning for students and enjoyment of the special events planned for Term 4. We want every P - 6 student 'to be known, valued and cared for' and to ensure that every student finds KPS a great place to come to every single day through the quality of the educational programs being provided every day!

✤ CHANGE OF DATE – FINAL SCHOOL DAY FOR ALL P – 6 STUDENTS IN 2022

An additional School development Day has been allocated for all NSW public schools for the end of this year by the Education Minister, Sarah Mitchell.

The last 2022 school day for all P – 6 students is now Friday 16 December 2022.

With this change, we ask that you plan for alternative care arrangements for your child / children for <u>Monday 19 December 2022</u>. There will be no teacher supervision or classes held at school on this day.

VISITORS TO KEGWORTH PUBLIC SCHOOL

Visitors and contractors can now check-in using two convenient methods:

- scanning our existing school QR code with a phone OR
- through the new concierge device, located at front office

Parents and carers are asked to sign in when you enter the school grounds to attend a school meeting with teachers, accessing the uniform shop or lost property or attending an assembly and the like.

✤ COVID – SMART MEASURES CONTINUE in TERM 4

As we move into the warmer months, NSW Health has advised that despite the steady decline in COVID-19 cases in the community there is a continued risk of new COVID-19 waves of transmission into summer.

The department is continuing with the following baseline COVID-smart measures throughout Term 4:

- Students, staff and families are to stay home if unwell and test for COVID-19 if showing any symptoms. RATs are available through contacting the school
- Students, staff and visitors to the school are encouraged to wear masks
- Wearing of masks on buses and transport to and from camps and excursions is strongly encouraged
- Staff and students are encouraged to maintain up to date vaccinations, including COVID-19 booster shots for anyone eligible.

✤ NON-COVID SCHOOL BASED VACCINATIONS

Due to the ongoing pandemic and stay-at-home orders that were in place over the previous two years, NSW Health have noted that some children and young people have missed out on the non-COVID school-based vaccination programs that they would have taken part in.

Parents and carers are reminded to make sure that all of their child's vaccinations are up-to-date, including other, non-COVID vaccinations.

If unsure about whether their child has missed any vaccinations, parents and carers should speak to their GP or go to <u>NSW Health's Immunisation requirements in primary and secondary schools</u>.

Parents and carers who have children with persistent or ongoing <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u> are encouraged to have these assessed by their local health care professional. These symptoms may be related to other illnesses that require treatment and management by a doctor.

SENIOR PLAYGROUND – MAJOR UPGRADE

Work on our Senior Playground upgrade has been slow over the past many weeks and the consistent rain has certainly not helped our situation.

- New stormwater pits have been completed and drainage is now attached to existing stormwater channels located further down in the playground, closer to the overhead walk bridge.
- Our existing sport court has been peeled back to allow the new drainage to be linked but also to expose the number of tree roots that have been lifting up the court over many years, posing a major trip hazard for our students when at play. Under the careful watch of arborists, contractors were able to reduce many of the tree roots without compromising the integrity of any of the trees located in this area.
- Proposed paved path leading from the driveway (near Team Kids) all the way down to the existing court has been plotted out and is just waiting for a number of sunny days to dry out the ground so that work can continue for this area.



A scaled plan of the Senior Playground upgrade works has been included on the next page, for your information.

- The shaded blue area depicts the new artificial-turfed multi-purpose court with line markings for soccer and a running track around the perimeter.
- A new paved pedestrian walkway, approx. 1.5m wide, will provide access from the driveway across to the toilet block, linking to another path that leads down towards the other end of the playground.

- The 'green space' (located on the right hand side of the plan) between the shaded blue area and the existing buildings of Team Kids and school toilets will see new natural grass planted. This new turfed area will be supported by an underground automated pop up watering system.
