* TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT & SCHOOL SAFETY

Thank you to the many parents and caregivers who have been using our 'Kiss and Drop" Zone correctly in the morning and afternoon. Parents & caregivers are reminded to stay in your car and only wait in this area for approximately 2 minutes.

If you're intending to use this Zone for afternoon pick up, please ensure that your child / children is aware of this so that teachers can send them directly out to you, as soon as you arrive.

If in the event, that the Zone is full, do not double park on Kegworth St. as this causes a bank up of cars along the street, making it dangerous for everyone coming into or exiting the school gates.

Parents and caregivers are also reminded once again, to not make u-turns into the school driveway or near the Kegworth St gates, at any time.

Some of our parents & carers, who appear to be rushing to either drop off or collect students, think that it is okay to quickly make a u-turn, to save time. This is never a safe practice and ultimately those few minutes that you think you are saving, could cost somebody's life.

If you need to make u-turn, please do so at the bottom of the street where it may be deemed a bit safer.

Inner West Council parking officers have been patrolling intermittingly, both in the morning and afternoon for a number of weeks now around the school perimeter. Some of our parents & carers have received parking infringements as a result of not obeying street parking signage or disobeying road rules.

* SOLAR MY SCHOOLS PROJECT

It's been a very long time coming, but we are very pleased to advise that work on the "Solar My School's Project" is finally starting on the western facing double story roof, as of this Wednesday 29 June 2022 (weather permitting). This joint project between the DET and the school was first discussed and formalised at the end of 2019. Our P&C successful received a grant through the 2019 Community Building Partnership, further supporting our school's environmental and sustainability focus, to the value of \$17500. These funds contributed to half of the overall project costs.

Sadly, as had been the case with many things over the past two years with COVID – 19, this project was stalled. It is anticipated that the solar panel installation on the school roof will be completed by the end of the first week of the school holidays. Thank you to our wonderful P&C for their continued support of our school projects.

2023 Applications to enrol in a NSW Government Preschool

"Wait List" applications are now open for 2023 Kegworth Pre-School!

Parents and caregivers who are seeking enrolment in the Pre-School for 2023 are requested to complete a "Wait List" application which is then required to be returned to the school office, as soon as possible.

Please note:

- That the "Wait List" application is only an expression of interest and does not imply that you will be successful in gaining a placement. Each year we have far more applications than positions available.
- According to the 'National Partnership Agreement on Early Childhood Education', every child, 12 months prior to full time schooling, will have access to a Pre-School program for 15 hours per week, 40 weeks a year. This will ensure that the Pre-School program is equitable for ALL children.
- Currently we offer 2 x programs "Kangaroos" and "Koalas"

There would then be the alternating Wednesday each fortnight between both programs.

• All "Wait List" applications must be submitted in person or by mail to the main school office.

Following lodgement of the waiting list application, during August to September 2022, you will be contacted with either:

- an offer of placement **OR**
- a notification that you are currently unsuccessful and have been placed on a waiting list.

Before your child starts Pre-School with us, we will need to sight and take a copy of:

- original birth certificate and or passport AND
- recent immunisation details

Your child must turn 4 years of age by 31 July the year they start Pre-School. Pre-School placements are for <u>one year only</u> – being the year before they start Kindergarten. If your child was born mid-year, please consider carefully the year you would like them to attend Pre-School.
