We are sad to advise that our long-term school custodian, Joseph Kwan has elected to retire from Kegworth after 11 years of service to our school and community.

Joseph has worked extremely hard at our school, working 5 days per week, starting very early for his morning shift and finishing quite late with his evening shift. He has always taken great pride in his work, ensuring that a high standard of cleanliness and care was always maintained throughout our school.

During the pandemic years, Joseph also worked tirelessly throughout the day, regularly sanitising classrooms desks, chairs, door handles, light switches, stair railings and any touch point imaginable. He was also regularly seen climbing about on the junior playground equipment, thoroughly sanitising after each play session, keeping us all safe and healthy.

Joseph went above and beyond in his role, often unseen, to support our Kegworth school community. Nothing was ever too much trouble. Many of you have probably met or at least seen Joseph during your time at Kegworth and no doubt join with our student and school staff in sincerely thanking him for his years of service and unflagging support of our school. We wish him all the very best for future years to come! Joseph's last day at Kegworth will be next week - Wednesday 31 August. At this stage, the school has not yet been advised by ISS Facility Services as to who his replacement will be.

STUDENT PREPARATIONS FOR 2023 – CURRENT KINDERGARTEN TO YEAR 5 ONLY

School planning for 2023 is now underway. Knowing who will be returning to Kegworth for the next year is invaluable to us in planning for classes, classroom spaces, staffing and school programs. For our school planning to be as accurate as is possible, could you please complete the appropriate e-form on the Skoolbag app. A separate e-form will be required for each child.

It would be appreciated if this information could be submitted no later than <u>Tuesday 6 September 2022.</u>

SENIOR PLAYGROUND – MAJOR UPGRADE

You may have noticed quite a bit of activity happening across the road on our Senior Playground over the past two weeks. The senior playground grassed area has been progressively deteriorating due to excessive foot traffic and over use, ongoing poor drainage and erosion of this space have also contributed to this issue over time. In view of these issues, the Department of Education - Asset Management have invested (value over \$600K) to fully fund an upgrade project of the Senior Playground, to include:

- Grade existing oval surface for better drainage flow towards stormwater pits.
- Provide additional stormwater pits to oval & connect to existing school stormwater to improve drainage across all surface areas.
- Installation of 960m2 (approx. 36m wide x 21m length) synthetic astro turf grass (sand based) multipurpose sport court with inbuilt line markings for soccer and running track. Includes suitable

under base & ag piping for increased drainage away from multipurpose court area to stormwater.

- Supply & installation of one x 20Lt inground concrete water tank (in front of Team Kids & senior toilet block buildings). Water collected from buildings will be used for the new playground irrigation system.
- Irrigation pump & automatic pop-up timer irrigation system to water remaining grassed oval area & garden beds (on both playgrounds sides).
- 360m2 concrete based & paved paths extending from current COLA (toilet block) towards the driveway & the creation of a new footpath (along Tebbutt Street side) to join onto existing sport court, leading towards access gate & overhead bridge.
- Provision of 20 x sandstone seating blocks position on site, to be advised.
- Estimated timeframe for completion 4 6 weeks, weather dependent.
- A detailed site plan of project works has been requested and will be made available for viewing, once received.

Please note:

- The current scope of works does not include the re-turfing of the remaining grassed oval area. The school will be fully funding this component of project works.
- This project does not include any works currently being considered for the Senior Playground via Kegworth's P&C or any associated P&C funds.
- DET Asset Management have fully covered costs for the supply and installation of the proposed in-ground water tank and irrigation system project which P&C had intended to fund through the 2021 Community Building Partnership Grant. Funds from this grant will now support the supply and installation of water tanks in the Kegworth Preschool.







SENIOR PLAYGROUND BOYS TOILETS

Our senior boys' toilets have been closed for most of last term and this term due to ceiling damage caused by the extensive rain that we experienced. Several contractors have been on site over many weeks, to determine the cause and means to rectify. It is believed that water seeping through the top concrete slab may be the cause. Final determination of how this will be rectified so that the toilets can once again be operational, is yet to be advised. In the meantime, our students continue to use the main school site toilets prior to going across for playground play. During play time, boys are also permitted to return to the main school site facilities, if required. The senior girls' toilets have not been impacted and remain fully operational.

***** STUDENT ABSENCE NOTIFICATIONS

Recently our school has updated its notification procedures to parents and carers of students who present as being absent from school, on any given day. Our school is now operating on an automated daily email response system to notify parents & carers that your child has been recorded as being absent. The email will only be sent to parents & carers if the school has not received any information by 12pm, each day. If you do receive an email, please respond by return email advising the school as to the nature of your child's absence. This information will then be updated on your child's school attendance record. To avoid receiving an email each day, parents & carers are encouraged to use the Skoolbag – "2022 Student Absentee" e-form or contact the school office directly via email or phone. Our new automated system will replace the school attendance letters that were previously sent home at the end of each week.

✤ ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL – CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION (AP - C&I)

The Department of Education has provided each school, under the DET's "School Success Model" with a newly created Assistant Principal position, to start in 2023. The new AP-C&I role is designed to improve literacy and numeracy outcomes through support of teaching staff and educational practices across the whole school. For Kegworth, this will be a fractional 3 x day per week position. The position will be filled via the DET's merit selection procedures, with a panel undertaken over the next weeks.

***** SCHOOL TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

At the beginning of this term, the school purchased an additional 3 x class sets of laptops and charging stations for student use. This means that all Stage 2 and 3 classes (x 7) now have their own independent set of laptops to enhance learning (previously one set was shared between two classes). Technology provisions for next year will now be put in place to supplement Ipads and / or laptops in the Stage 1 and Early Stage 1 classes.

✤ IRON COVE NETWORK PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL

Last week I and many of our Year 1 parents & carers had the pleasure of watching our newly formed Junior Dance group perform at the Iron Cove Network Performing Arts Festival at the Seymour Centre. The festival is a new initiative for our network of schools to showcase the performing arts items from local schools. Without being biased, our Year 1 dancers were not only the youngest performers but were the highlight of the Twilight Concert. Their high energy on stage and sheer performance enjoyment, delighted the audience, who could not help but to give them a rousing applause! Thank you to our amazing Year 1 dancers for your outstanding performance and to teachers, Miss Courtney Levin and Ms Orlagh Healy for your support and coordination. Thank you to our parents & carers who attended and actively supported our Kegworth kids. If you would like to see the Year 1 dance rotuine, come to our Fathers & Carers Day on Tuesday 30 August!

INTERRELATE's FAMILY EVENING PROGRAM ONLINE

Our school has booked an online personal development course on **WEDNESDAY 31 AUGUST** on the above topics. We are using a company called Interrelate. Kegworth have worked with Interrelate for a very long time through our Stage 3 Personal Development Program.

The online course is in addition to the usual course that will run for Stage 3 in Term 4 this year. There will be courses for both Year 5 and Year 6 in Term 4.

The online program will run from 6:00pm until 8.15pm and is directed at children from Years 3 to 6.

The program is in 2 sessions:

Session 1 - WHERE DID I COME FROM? (aimed mainly at Years 3 & 4, but appropriate for Years 3 - 6) from 6:00pm – 7:00pm

Session 2 - PREPARING FOR PUBERTY (aimed mainly at Years 5 & 6, but appropriate for Years 3 - 6) from 7:15pm – 8:15pm

You can choose to participate in just one or both of the sections, depending on what you see as appropriate for your child.

The course costs \$36:00 for 1 registration (a registration is essentially your household.) This is the price regardless of whether you participate in just one or both of the sections. Payment is made directly to Interrelate.

There is a maximum of 120 registrations and operates on a first in first served basis.

2023 Applications to enrol in a NSW Government Preschool

"Wait List" applications are now open for 2023 Kegworth Pre-School!

Parents and caregivers who are seeking enrolment in the Pre-School for 2023 are requested to complete a "Wait List" application which is then required to be returned to the school office, as soon as possible.

Please note:

- That the "Wait List" application is only an expression of interest and does not imply that you will be successful in gaining a placement. Each year we have far more applications than positions available.
- According to the 'National Partnership Agreement on Early Childhood Education', every child, 12 months prior to full time schooling, will have access to a Pre-School program for 15 hours per week, 40 weeks a year. This will ensure that the Pre-School program is equitable for ALL children.
- Currently we offer 2 x programs "Kangaroos" and "Koalas"

With this option, 2 days remain constant with both programs, i.e: Monday <u>AND</u> Tuesday - "Kangaroos", OR Thursday <u>AND</u> Friday – "Koalas".

There would then be the alternating Wednesday each fortnight between both programs.

• All "Wait List" applications must be submitted in person or by mail to the main school office.

Following lodgement of the waiting list application, during August to September 2022, you will be contacted with either:

- an offer of placement **OR**
- a notification that you are currently unsuccessful and have been placed on a waiting list.

Before your child starts Pre-School with us, we will need to sight and take a copy of:

- original birth certificate and or passport AND
- recent immunisation details

Your child must turn 4 years of age by 31 July the year they start Pre-School. Pre-School placements are for **<u>one year only</u>** – being the year before they start Kindergarten. If your child was born mid-year, please consider carefully the year you would like them to attend Pre-School.
